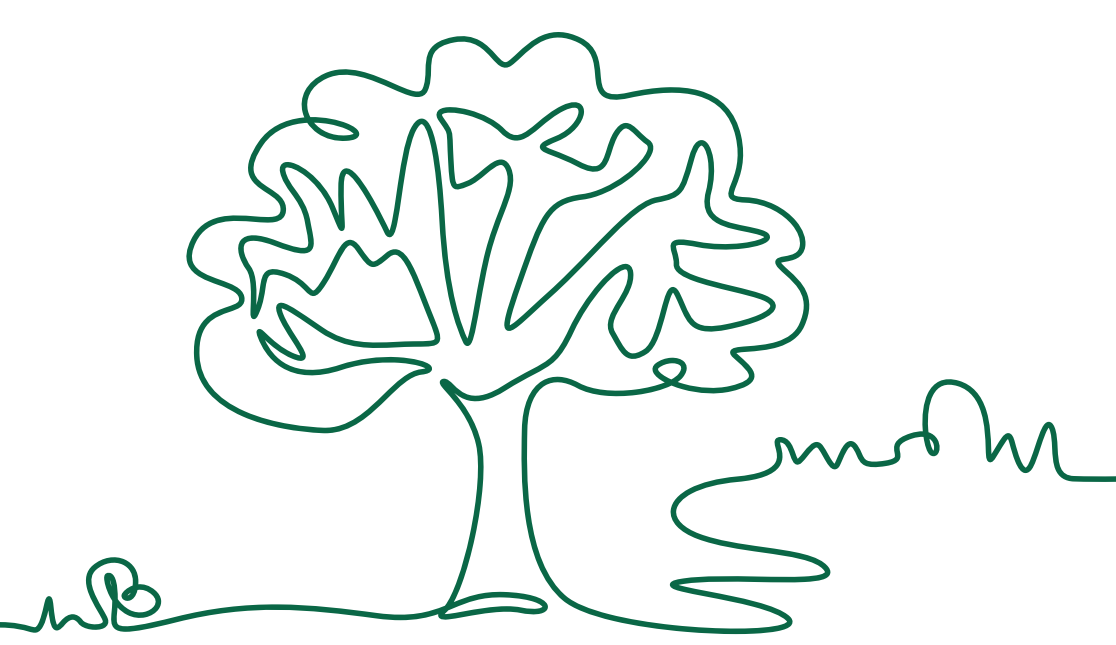

# 1 HARITARANG



## It's Haritarang time at SankalpTaru this January — and WOW, it's already our 10th Annual Meet!

As we step into the season of **HariTarang**, SankalpTaru's annual retreat, we find ourselves reflecting on the powerful synergy between unity and purpose through **the three pillars—Manan, Masti, and Umang**.

This retreat offers a unique opportunity for **our pan-India team** to meet, connect, and celebrate the progress we've made in our shared mission. It's more than just a celebration of planting; it's a time to blend **Manan**—where we pause to thoughtfully reflect on how we can continue to grow and do more together; **Masti**—the joy and camaraderie that unite us in our collective journey; and **Umang**—the energy and enthusiasm we draw from our shared efforts.

In these moments of reflection and action, we are reminded of the deeper purpose behind our work—a purpose that goes beyond planting trees to shaping a future rooted in collaboration, growth, and sustainability.

In this edition of the Newsletter, we offer a closer look at how **HariTarang** unfolded this year, the meaningful impact of our collective efforts, and the exciting initiatives that continue to unite us in building a greener tomorrow.

This year, the retreat returned to **Barmer, Rajasthan**, where the very first HariTarang took place in 2016, and the desert landscapes set the perfect backdrop for a week of learning, collaboration, and celebration.

The experience at the venue began with a traditional welcome — lamp lighting, colorful Rajasthani turbans, and a recap video of Haritarang 2025 at the Peepal Research Centre. The new **STF logo** was unveiled, marking the start of another chapter of growth. The **Innovation Pavilion** was inaugurated to showcase new technologies developed by SankalpTaru, including an updated forestation device with a built-in music system designed to reduce plant stress for foresters.

## Manan: Reflection and Learning

Thoughtful sessions anchored the week, focusing on **strategic alignment and knowledge sharing**. Teams reviewed progress, reflected on challenges, and explored opportunities for greater collaboration. Interactive activities, including a **ChatGPT-based storytelling and poster-making exercise**, allowed participants to creatively depict field operations and farmer interactions.

Discussions emphasized cross-team collaboration, workflow improvements, and the integration of innovative tools for plantation efficiency. Each session sowed seeds of clarity, purpose, and actionable ideas, strengthening commitment to SankalpTaru's mission.



## Masti: The Spirit of Fun

While reflection shaped our minds, **Masti** energized our hearts. Evenings were alive with **Rajasthani folk songs, traditional dances, and cultural performances** that celebrated our pan-India diversity.

The desert adventure continued with a **desert safari in the Sam Sand Dunes**, and visits to **Jaisalmer** offered moments of exploration and team bonding. Leisure activities, including **shopping at Barmer**, added delight and strengthened camaraderie. The first evening and the concluding **Cultural Night** were punctuated with laughter, music, and shared stories — a true celebration of unity, joy, and pride in our work.

## Umang: Growing Together

The final pillar, **Umang**, brought action, empowerment, and hands-on experience. The team visited the **Nimbla site** and **Ghotaru / Aapno School**, gifting a piano, interacting with confident students, and engaging in **tree plantation activities**, instilling awareness and stewardship in the younger generation.

Field visits to **INDIA Plantation sites** revealed the resilience required in harsh desert conditions. Teams observed huts built by farmers, borewells, and the meticulous maintenance of saplings. Practical lessons, such as **cleaning utensils with sand due to scarce water**, highlighted local ingenuity and sustainability in action.

Hands-on sustainability workshops allowed teams to **craft paper bags from newspapers** for local vendors and **build bird nests**, which were later sent to Ghotaru. These activities reinforced the connection between innovation, environmental stewardship, and community well-being.



The retreat concluded with presentations from the **Operations, Finance, HR, and Legal teams**, open discussions for new ideas, **Prize Distribution**, and heartfelt **Felicitation**. The final evening's Cultural Night celebrated every contribution — a testament to the **team's creativity, collaboration, and shared purpose**.

HariTarang 2026 reminded us that our mission extends far beyond planting trees. It is about **nurturing people, empowering communities, and strengthening bonds** that help us create a sustainable and vibrant future together. 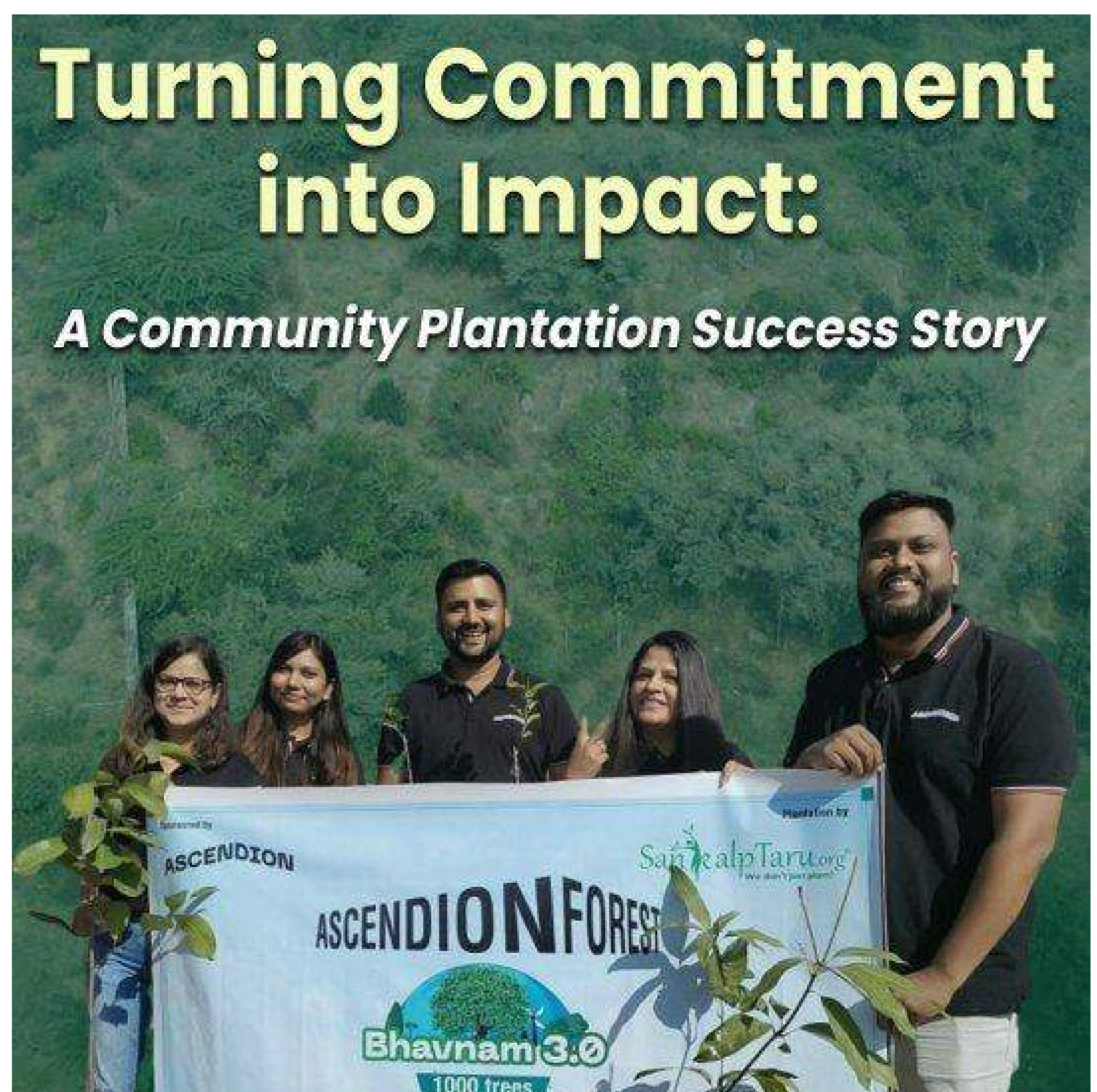


### Turning Commitment into Impact with Ascendion

### Driving Change Together: Kia India's Climate Action Partnership

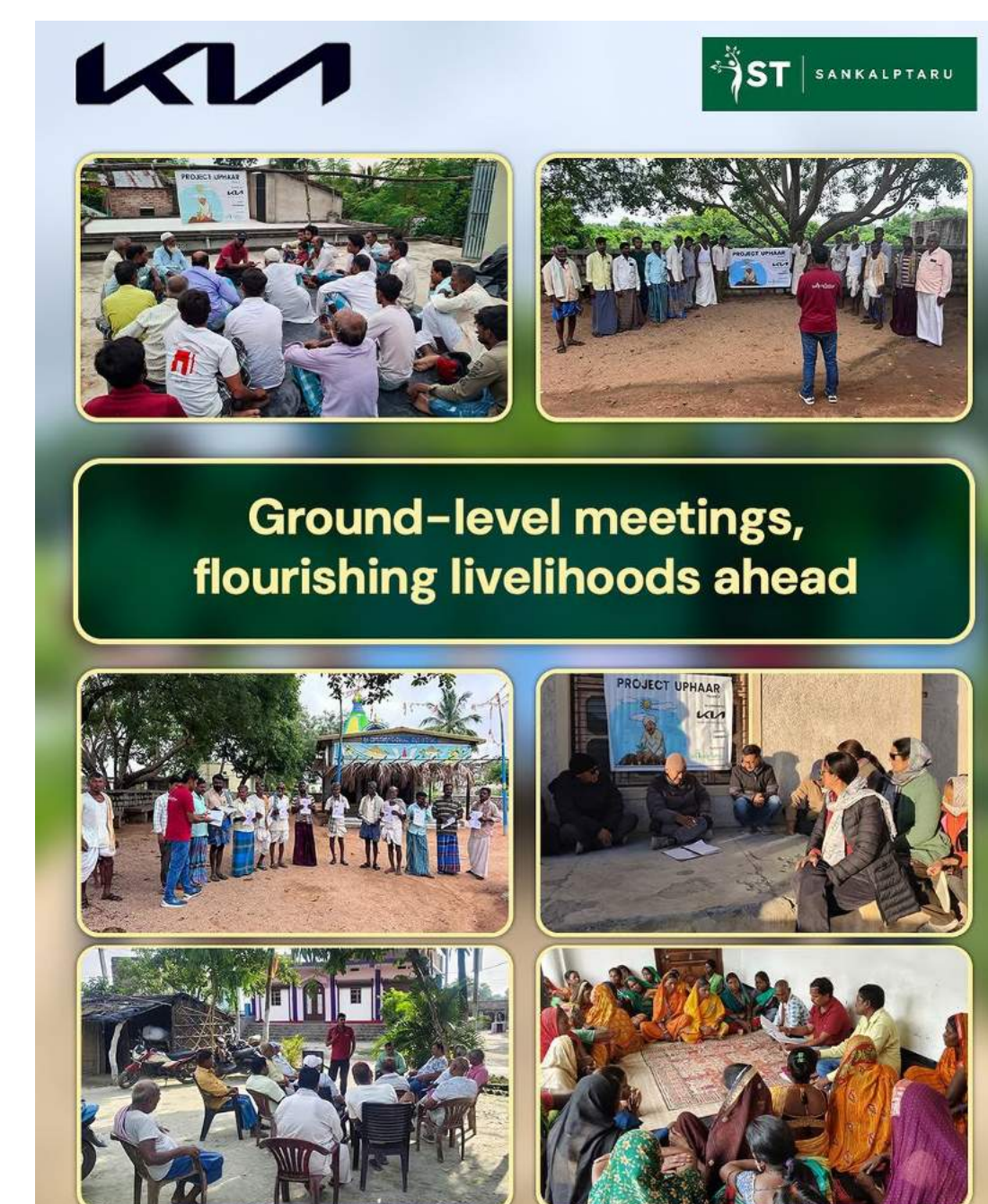
As part of our ongoing Project Uphaar monthly series, this month we turn the lens toward the conversations that matter most—farmer meetings that help the initiative truly thrive.

The true key to the successful progression of our three-year-long partnership with Kia India is the farmer. Every milestone we celebrate begins at the ground level, in conversations that matter.

With deep gratitude to **Kia India**, we take pride in how this collaboration has allowed us to expand across states and communities. Together, we have supported more than 1800 farmers under **Project Uphaar**, transforming Kia India's vision of green growth into a living reality that continues to flourish across rural landscapes.

Our **field coordinators** engage closely with farming communities—listening to regional needs, understanding the soil, and standing alongside them as trusted guides. These meetings provide farmers with practical knowledge on sustainable practices: from preparing organic compost and conserving water, to adopting modern planting techniques and managing crops after harvest.

Every conversation between our coordinators and farmers is a moment of shared learning—built on trust, care, and the simple act of listening. These exchanges transform guidance into confidence, enabling farmers to nurture each sapling with the knowledge and support it needs to grow strong.



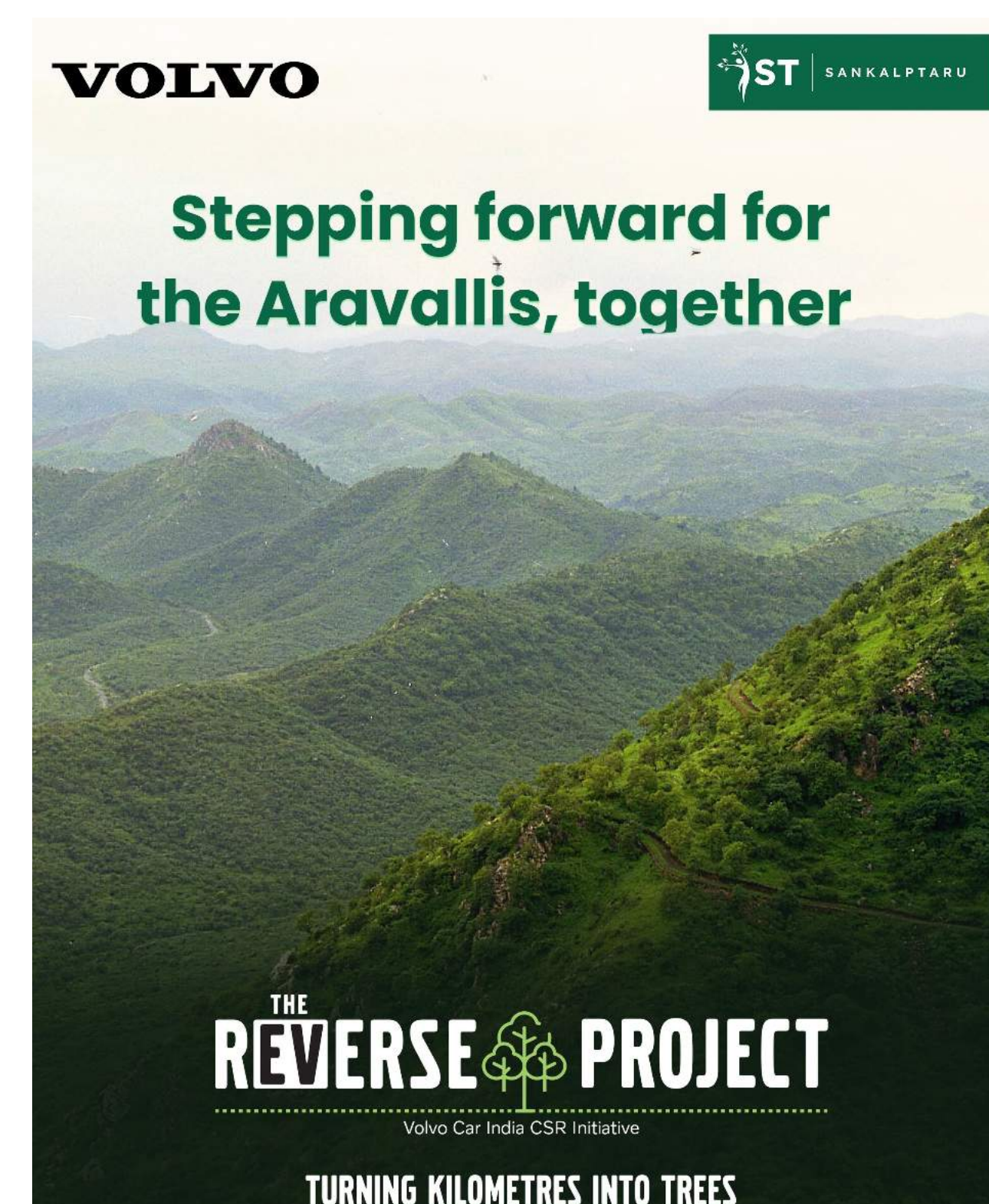
### Stepping Forward for Aravallis with Volvo Car India

As part of their **FY25-26 CSR commitment**, Volvo has extended its collaborative partnership with **SankalpTaru as the on-ground implementation partner** in the Aravallis through the **Community Barren Land Transformation** initiative.

Under the Volvo's sustainability-driven **Reverse Project**, which turns kilometres into trees, over **20,000+ native saplings** are being planted across 20 acres of degraded land along the Gurugram–Faridabad highway, supported by **SankalpTaru's on-ground expertise**. The work is supported by community involvement, structured monitoring, and nurtured with technology-enabled monitoring — just the way long-term restoration needs to be.

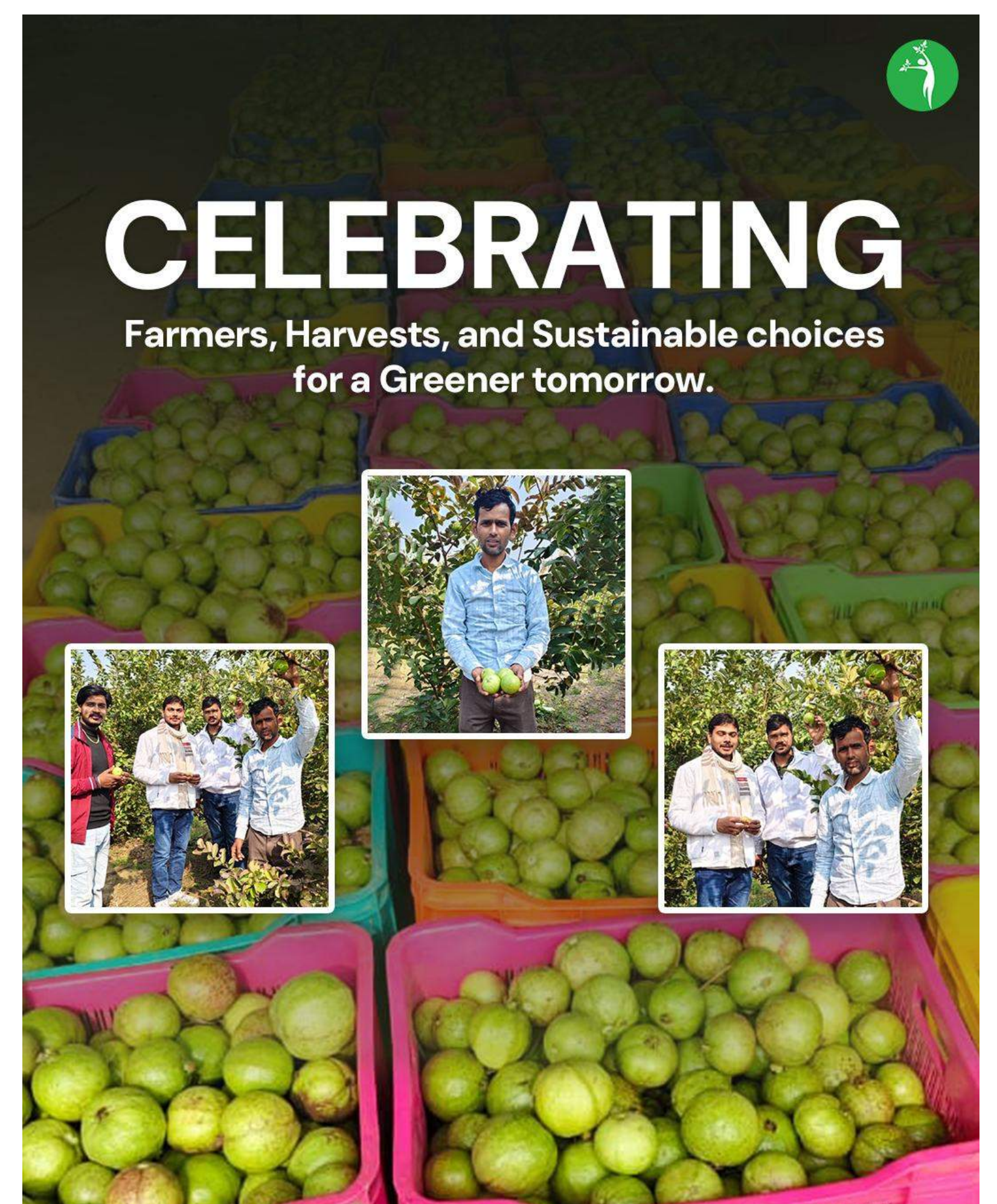
## A Bountiful Start to the New Year!

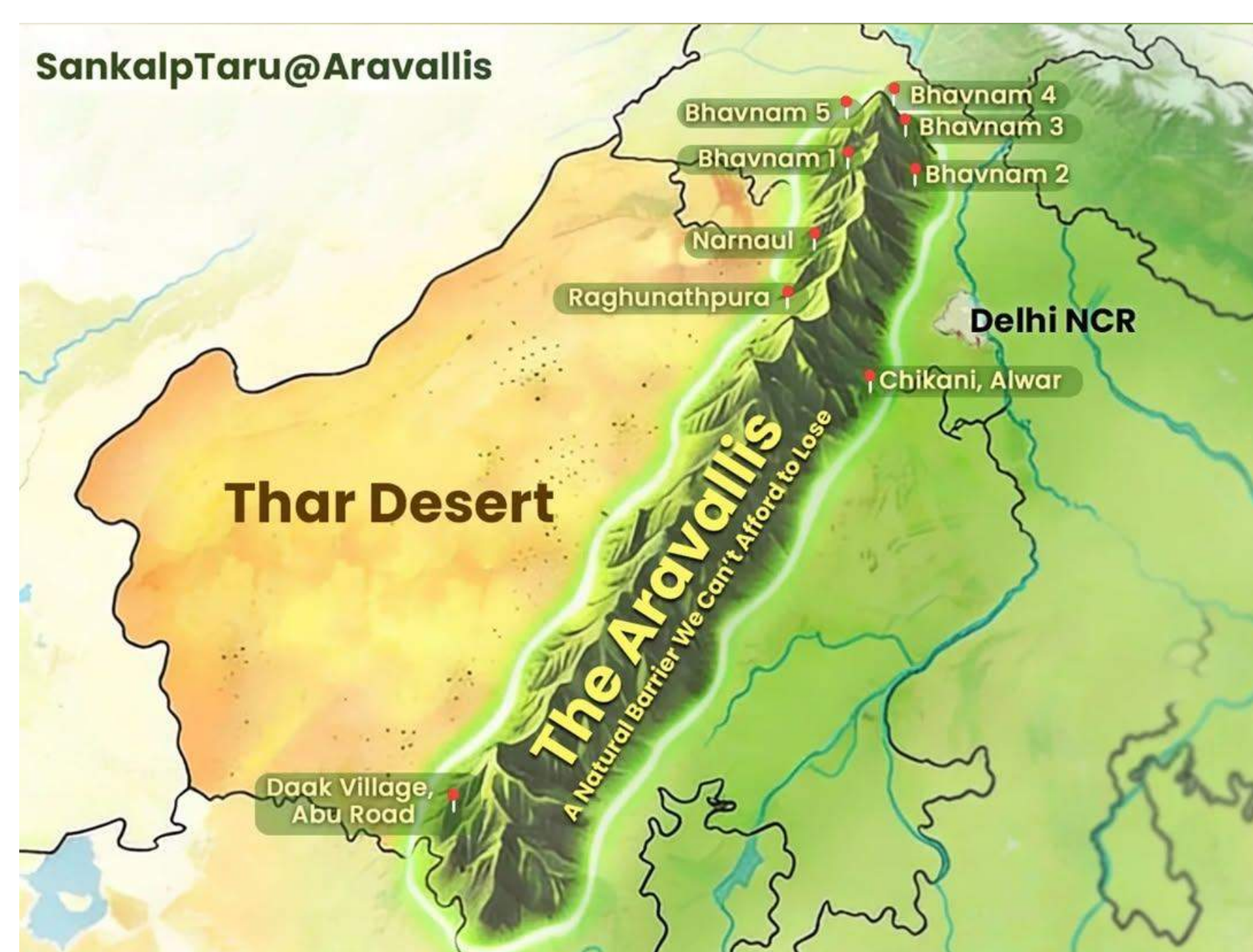
## SankalpTaru's footprint @ Aravallis

With eco-concerns around the Aravallis weighing heavily, we share a glimpse of resilience and renewal taking root. The Aravallis are among the oldest mountain ranges in the world. Preserving their ecological balance is not just about the present moment—it is about honouring a legacy that has safeguarded land, water, and life across generations.

For over seven years, from the foothills of Mount Abu to Gurgaon, SankalpTaru Foundation has remained committed to restoring native species and strengthening the natural ecology across the Aravalli range. Quietly and consistently, our teams have worked on the ground—nurturing indigenous trees, reviving degraded landscapes, and protecting an ecosystem that has endured for centuries.

Through close collaboration with the local community, we are working to revive this land by planting over 10,000 native trees, supported by solar-powered drip irrigation. Gradually, signs of renewal have begun to emerge—birdlife returning, grazing grounds regenerating, and the landscape slowly finding its rhythm again.




## Climate Literacy – Carbon Budget

This month’s Climate Literacy explores Carbon Budget —the science of how much CO<sub>2</sub> we can emit before crossing dangerous climate thresholds.

India is advancing this mission through renewable energy, afforestation, and industrial innovation, aiming for net-zero by 2070.

### CLIMATE LITERACY

Word of the month: Carbon Budget

1.5°C threshold

CO<sub>2</sub>

The carbon budget is the maximum amount of CO<sub>2</sub> humanity can release into the atmosphere without exceeding a critical global warming threshold—most notably 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels.

This budget is calculated using climate models that link cumulative emissions to rising temperatures. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) provides these estimates, updating them as scientific knowledge evolves.

**Goal:** Stay within the budget before the planet overspends its future.

### Where the World Stands

**The global carbon budget is shrinking fast.**

- As of 2025, the remaining budget for 1.5°C is about 130 billion tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>. At current emission rates, this will be exhausted in just over 3 years.
- Fossil fuel emissions rose again in 2025, reaching a record high, with global emissions projected to increase by 1.1%.
- Climate trackers estimate that at current trends, the world has less than a 17–33% chance of staying below 1.5°C.
- For 2°C warming, the budget lasts longer—around 9 years—but still demands urgent cuts.

**Key Insight:** Countries are overspending the carbon budget, and the clock is ticking.

### Carbon Balance Sheet – Global & India

**Global Snapshot**


- Remaining carbon budget for 1.5°C: ~130 billion tonnes CO<sub>2</sub> (≈ 3 years at current rates).
- Annual fossil fuel emissions: ~37 billion tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>, overspending the budget.
- Forests absorb ~16 billion tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>, oceans absorb ~25% of emissions.
- Probability of staying below 1.5°C: <33%.

**India's Snapshot**

- Annual emissions:** ~3.22 billion tonnes CO<sub>2</sub> (2025).
- Forests store ~7,124 million tonnes carbon, removing ~150 million tonnes CO<sub>2</sub> annually.
- Renewables expanding, slowing growth, but coal remains dominant.
- Net-zero target:** 2070, requiring faster cuts and stronger sinks.

**Balance Insight:** Current debits outweigh credits, meaning the budget is overspent. Strengthening natural sinks and cutting fossil fuel use are critical to restore balance.

### India's Carbon Budget Profile

India is the third-largest global emitter, yet its per-capita emissions remain among the lowest.

- Emissions:** In 2025, India's fossil fuel CO<sub>2</sub> emissions reached 3.22 billion tonnes, rising only 1.4% compared to 2024.
- Sinks:** Forests store ~7,124 million tonnes of carbon, removing ~150 million tonnes CO<sub>2</sub> annually.
- Renewables:** Rapid expansion of solar and wind slowed emission growth, supported by favorable monsoon conditions.
- Net-Zero Target:** India aims for 2070, balancing industrial growth with afforestation, agroforestry, and carbon capture pilots.

**Key Insight:** India's carbon budget is tight—progress in renewables and forest sinks is promising, but industrial emissions remain the biggest debit.

### The Way Forward

Balancing the carbon budget demands urgent, collective action.

**Global Priorities**

- Rapid emission cuts in energy, transport, and industry.
- Protect and expand forests, wetlands, and oceans as natural sinks.
- Scale carbon capture technologies alongside renewable energy.
- Stronger international cooperation to align budgets with 1.5°C pathways.

**India's Priorities**

- Accelerate renewable energy deployment to reduce coal dependence.
- Expand agroforestry and soil carbon initiatives for rural resilience.
- Invest in industrial carbon capture pilots in steel and cement.
- Build robust data systems to track emissions and sinks transparently.

- Promote carbon literacy in schools, workplaces, and communities.

**Why It Matters**

Every tonne saved keeps us closer to the 1.5°C threshold. Every action taken strengthens the planet's balance sheet.

**Key Insight:** Awareness is the first step, but collective action is the only way forward.

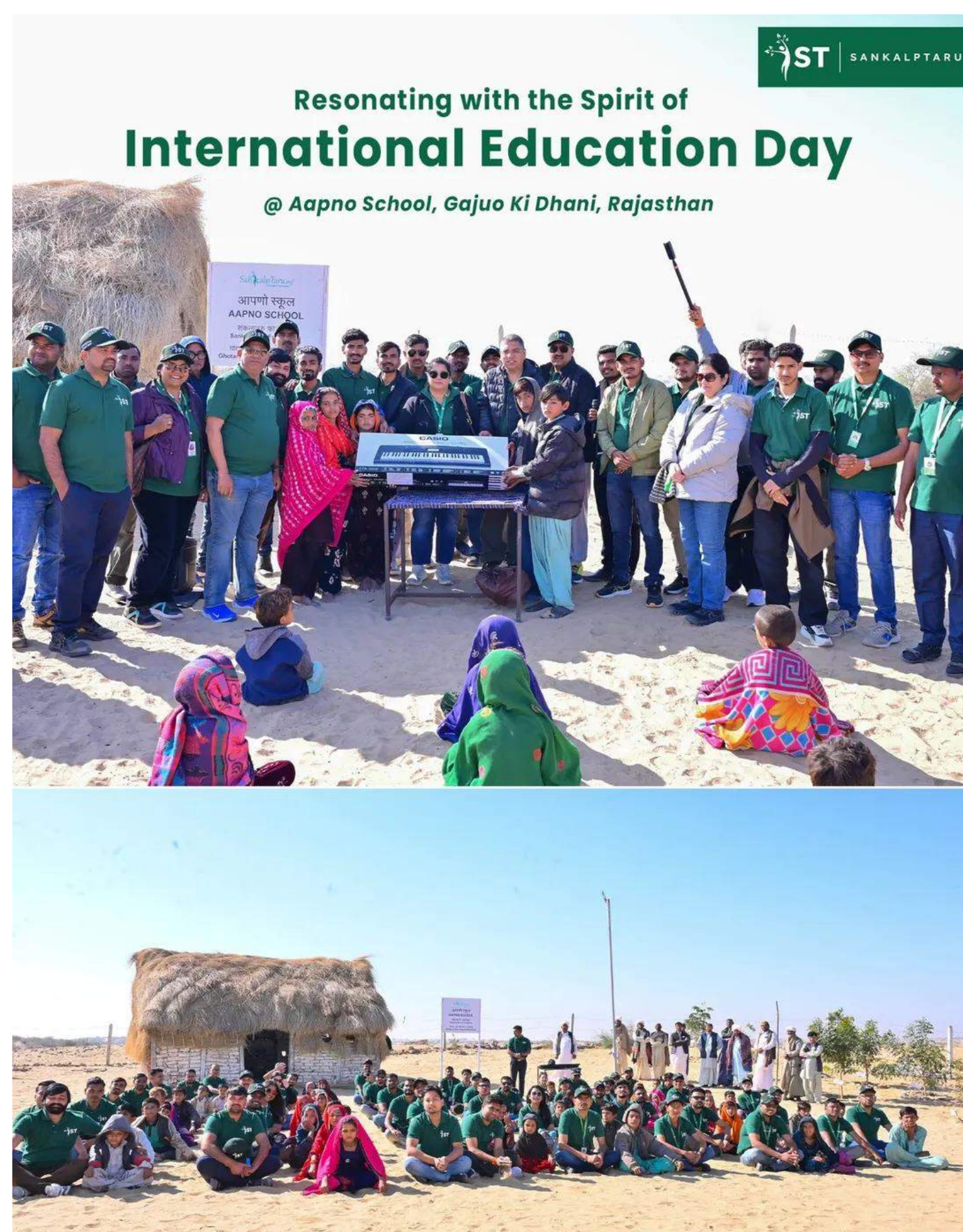

## Echoes of the Community



As part of our ongoing Project Uphaar series, we turn the spotlight on how our field coordinators identify and support the farmers who can benefit the most from our programs.

Traveling across remote villages, our field coordinators take the time to understand each farmer's challenges and clearly explain the guidance and resources available to them.

Once selected, farmers receive hands-on support, from intercropping techniques and soil management to personalized monitoring of their crops and saplings.


This consistent attention ensures that every intervention thrives — not just in the land, but in the farmer's confidence and ability to manage it sustainably.

In this episode, we share the story of a farmer whose life is on the cusp of transformation, guided by the right support, care, and expertise.



### Echoes of the Community

Story of our Farmer beneficiary from Theog, Shimla, HP



For over 50+ years, Bhagath Ram of Theog, Shimla, HP, had tended his 2.5-acre land with the same fodder crops and a few livestock, earning a modest income of just around ₹30,000 per year. Life in the remote hills brought its own challenges — limited access to guidance, unpredictable rainfall, and fragile soil. In 2022, our coordinators identified the potential to support Bhagath Ram, and under **Kia India's Project Uphaar**, SankalpTaru introduced approximately **500 apple saplings** to his farm, opening a new chapter of hope and opportunity.



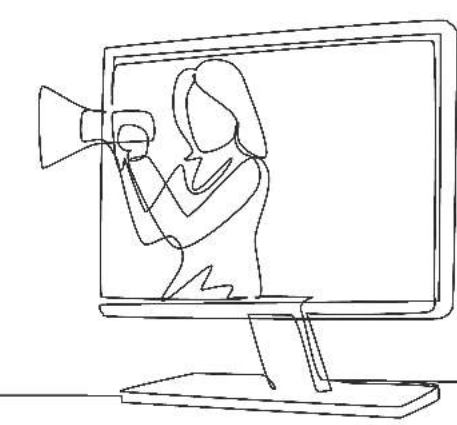


These saplings are more than just trees; they represent a chance to diversify, improve his livelihood, and sow the seeds of a brighter future. Our field coordinators visit regularly to ensure the saplings are thriving, monitor soil health, and provide guidance whenever needed. They help farmers like Bhagath Ram adapt techniques, troubleshoot issues, and make informed decisions for sustainable growth. The connection is more than technical — it is built on trust, understanding, and shared purpose.

Often, they begin by pausing, noticing, and giving a second life to what's already around us.

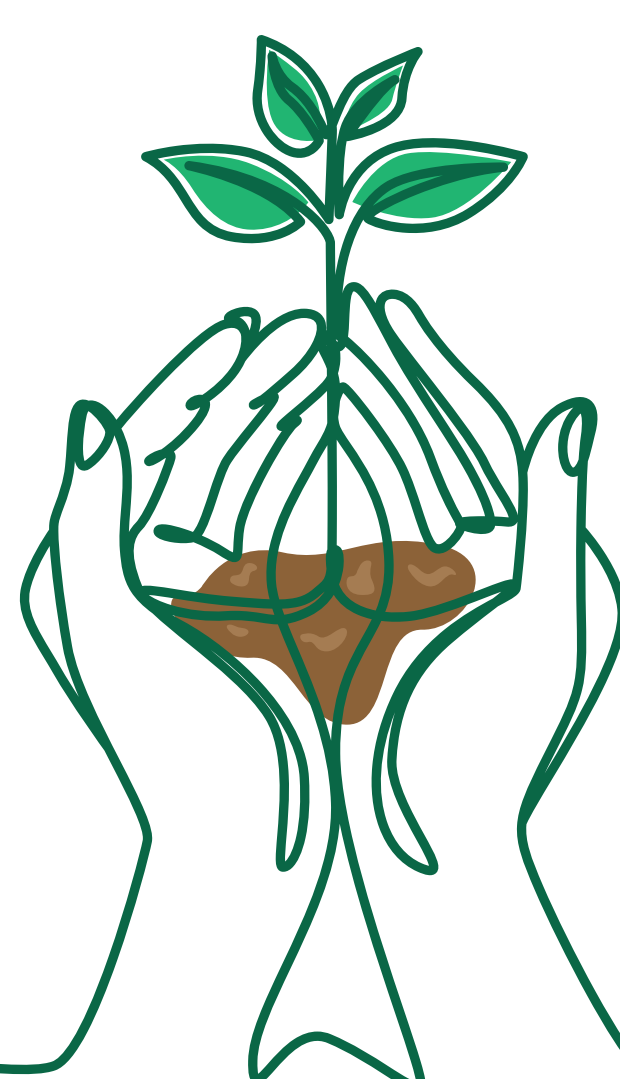
